QUESTION PRESENTED:

Whether three committees of the House of Representatives had the constitutional and statutory authority to issue subpoenas to third-party custodians for the personal records of the sitting President of the United States.

THE APPLICATION (19A640) FOR STAY PRESENTED TO JUSTICE GINSBURG AND BY HER REFERRED TO THE COURT IS GRANTED, AND IT IS ORDERED THAT THE MANDATE OF THE UNITED STATES COURT OF APPEALS FOR THE SECOND CIRCUIT, CASE NO. 19-1540, IS HEREBY STAYED PENDING FURTHER ORDER OF THE COURT.
